

### PC TOM NORTON - CRIME REPORT MARCH 2016

Below is the crime report from both January and February. A few of these crimes are believed to be linked.

2 thefts from motor vehicle at Grosvenor Pulford. Both were panel vans and happened on the same night.

Theft from Grosvenor garden centre. Believed to be employee.

Sheep on the road opposite Grosvenor garden centre.

Damage only RTC outside Grosvenor Pulford. One car left the scene.

Road related traffic offence. Near miss by vehicle towards a cyclist. Helmet camera captured image.

Nuisance calls. Believed to be a national scam and reassurance offered to the resident that she was at no risk.

These three offences are all linked

2 thefts from motor vehicle. Vehicles left unlocked

Theft from motor vehicle. Separate street but occurred on same night and under same circumstances.

Theft. bike stolen from front of house. Believed to be associated with above thefts and recovered to owner. Ridden between above locations and then dumped.

Suspicious person. Ended up being friends checking on occupant who had spotted a group of people outside their house.

The major concern has been the thefts from motor vehicles happening in Pulford. I have leaflet dropped a hundred houses in the area to remind them the importance of keeping vehicles locked and that the area has been targeted. Bright pink posters have also been placed up to remind occupants to lock vehicles at night. Another concern is that vehicle owners have been leaving vehicles unlocked at night. Part of the leaflet was crime reduction advice so hopefully people will have taken the advice. The area has been receiving additional patrols and since the break ins there have been non further to report. I have begun liaising with the PCSO for Rossett from North Wales Police and information sharing regarding our beats due to the proximity of the two.

I was only able to conduct one speed watch in Pulford throughout February. This was on the 16<sup>th</sup> February between 15:55 and 16:25. 52 vehicles travelled under 30, 14 between 31 and 34 mph, and 3 over 35 mph. Those above 35 were dealt with. I will be conducting more speed watch over the next couple of weeks, but as I need another PCSO to assist with this it makes it difficult to regularly conduct. Again I am trying to find an appropriate way to attract members of the public to volunteer for this, but have not had much of a response yet. Jim's speed reports also prove useful as to when is best to conduct these, they are much appreciated.

Police surgery is booked in with Grosvenor Garden Centre for the 14<sup>th</sup> April. I will forward the posters for you tomorrow. Hopefully we get a better turnout this month.

I will send March's police report along for April's meeting, but I can already let you know it has been extremely quiet. Any questions please get in touch.
